INTRODUCTION

XESSON THANKFUL

thank·ful (thängk'fəl) adj.

- 1. Aware and appreciative of a benefit; grateful.
- 2. Expressive of gratitude: a thankful smile.



- Thankfulness is a personal consciousness and acknowledgment of benefits that we have received from God, based on His grace, mercy, and love.
- Thankfulness is shown both personally and publicly.



- For life
- For health
- For strength
- For abilities
- For material provisions
- For family and friends
- For job, business, or profession
- For safety and security
- For the ability to care for family
- For liberty
- For opportunities to enjoy a measure of happiness
- For salvation
- For the hope of heaven



Lesson: THE LORD WANTS ALL OF US TO HAVE AN ATTITUDE OF THANKFULNESS TO GOD.

The healing of the ten lepers in Luke 17:11-19 shows us three truths that manifest an attitude of thankfulness

THE CAUSE OF A THANKFUL ATTITUDE



- All ten lepers realized that they had a terrible need.
 - Leprosy was an infectious skin disease
 - Those with leprosy were considered unclean and unable to worship in the temple
 - Those with leprosy were considered more sinful that everyone else—putting them in a emotional state of depression and despair
 - Jews called leprosy "the finger of God" implying that one with leprosy was under punishment from God.

- All ten lepers cried out to Jesus for mercy they knew that Jesus had the power to heal them.
- All ten lepers were cleansed by Jesus— Jesus told all ten to show themselves to the priests.
- **Problem**: Only one of the ten came back to give glory to God.



- Why were the nine lepers not thankful?
- Suggestion #1: They were so taken up with the cure that they forgot to give thanks.
- Suggestion #2: They were afraid to give thanks—publicly thanking Jesus might get them into trouble with the religious leaders.
- Suggestion #3: They were ashamed to give thanks—publicly thanking Jesus would embarrass them in front of others

- Suggestion #4: They were too cautious to give thanks—publicly thanking Jesus might cause a "leper riot."
- Suggestion #5: There were too proud to give thanks—publicly thanking Jesus might make them feel inferior.
- Suggestion #6: They did not believe that Jesus really healed them—it was luck or coincidence or the fact that they were not really sick.

 Applicational Point: Realizing that God meets our physical, material, emotional, and spiritual needs, based on His grace, mercy, and love (NOT based on our works, status, or assumption of worthiness) naturally leads us to an attitude of thankfulness.



THE CHARACTER OF A THANKFUL ATTITUDE



- All ten lepers owed thanks to the Lord
- Problem: Only one of the ten turned back to give thanks to the Lord
 - He prostrated himself before the Lord
 - He publically glorified
 God



- True thanksgiving is a right attitude
 - It realizes what God has done—everybody has something to be thankful for.
 - It wants to be thankful, no matter what others might think or do.
- Can you think of something that God has done for you, that really made you happy?

- True thanksgiving is a right **action**.
 - While is right to be grateful for things, true thanksgiving looks beyond the blessing to the One whose grace made all things possible.
 - Gratitude is directed toward the Person, it is NOT focused on the blessing (e.g., you are going to get more blessings)
 - Christ, not the blessing, is what is important. True thanksgiving draws attention to Christ, both in private and in public.



THE CONSEQUENCES OF A THANKFUL ATTITUDE



- The Lord asked the thankful leper, who happened to be a Samaritan, "were there not ten cleansed? But were are the nine?
- Note carefully: The Lord did not take back the healing of the other nine, but He did honor the one who gave thanks.

- The Lord wants to be thanked!!
 - This is NOT because the Lord wants His ego stroked.
 - This is because He wants us to realize His grace, mercy, compassion, and love in our lives.
 - Note: Even we appreciate being thanked for anything we do for others. We are grieved by unthankfulness.
- True thanksgiving pleases the Lord (e.g., we recognize who He is and what He has done for us).
- The Lord honors those who thankful to Him.



A CHALLENGE FOR YOU

• DOES YOUR LIFE SHOW A THANKFUL ATTITUDE??

3 WAYS TO FAIL at everything in life:

Complain about everything
 Blame others for your problems
 Never be grateful

RECEIVE THE LORD JESUS CHRIST AS YOUR SAVIOUR TODAY!!



- Acknowledge that the Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, <u>died</u> on the cross for your sin, and that He <u>arose</u> again from the dead on the third day.
- 2. Admit that you are a sinner, guilty of sin and responsible and accountable to a holy God for your sin, and that you are under His just condemnation and eternal punishment for your sin.
- **3. Accept** the Lord Jesus Christ as your Lord and Saviour by **receiving** His provision of salvation through your faith in Him alone.
