THE RAISING OF JAIRUS' DAUGHTER MARK 5:21-24, 35-43 (cf. Matt.9:18-19, 23-26; Luke 8:41-42, 49-56)

INTRODUCTION

- No question disturbs us more than the question "Why???"
 - "Why" did God let this happen to me?
 - "Why" didn't God answer my prayer for help?
 - "Why does God allow evil things to happen?



 While God does not always give us full answers to the "Why" questions in this earthly life, He does give us a way of looking at the difficult question of "Why."



- LESSON: Christ gives us a new way at looking at the difficult question of "Why."
- From the miracle of the raising of Jairus' daughter from the dead, we will learn five insights that will give us a new way at looking at the difficult question of "Why."



IN TIMES OF <u>DISTRESS</u>, CHRIST IS <u>WILLING</u> (Mark 5:21-24)



- The Problem: Jairus' daughter was at the point of death, and her loving father was at the point of despair.
- The Petition: The father begged Jesus to come to his house and lay His hands on his daughter.
- The Point: Jesus stands ready to help those who come to the throne of grace

IN TIMES OF <u>DELAY</u>, CHRIST IS <u>WORKING</u> (Mark 5:25-34)

- **The Delay**: The incident of the woman who touched the hem of Jesus' garment.
- The Determination
 - To show what faith is.
 - To show what the power of Christ is like.
- The Point: When we cannot see or understand the "Why" of God's delay, we must trust the One who has promised never to leave or forsake us.



IN TIMES OF <u>DISAPPOINTMENT</u>, CHRIST IS <u>WATCHING (Mark 5:35-36)</u>



- The Message of Disappointment: What Jairus feared the most happened--his daughter died before Jesus could get there and lay his hands on her.
- The Message Against Doubt: Just when Jairus had lost all hope, Jesus commanded him to stop being afraid and to keep on believing (e.g., in His ability and power).
- The Point: The Lord can give hope in a situation that seems hopeless.

IN TIMES OF <u>DELIVERANCE</u>, CHRIST IS <u>WONDERFUL</u> (Mark 5:37-42)

- **Powerful to Command:** Only Peter, James and John were permitted to go with Him (for personal specific instruction)
- Powerful to Correct
 - The commotion by the professional mourners and the implication of hopelessness that comes with death.
 - The ridicule by the professional mourners and the implication of the permanency of death.
 - Note: Christ permitted them to laugh but not witness the miracle!!





• Powerful to Call to Life!!

- Only six people were allowed in the room: the three disciples, the parents, and the Lord.
- The Lord took the dead hand (which act made Him ceremonially unclean), spoke to the body, and instantly the child rose and began to walk about.
- It is always the voice of the Lord that raises the dead on earth (Luke 7:14; John 11:43) and in the future (John 5:28).
- Point: The Lord has the sovereign authority over life and death—thus, no earthly problem is a problem for Him!!

IN TIMES OF <u>DIRECTION</u>, CHRIST IS <u>WISE</u> (Mark 5:43)

• Direction Concerning the Facts

- Jesus ordered the parents not to spread the news about what happened.
- Christ told them to feed the child

• The Point:

- People would know what happened by the child herself being seen!!
- Christ wanted people to see the results of what He did and then make up their minds about Him.
- Christ does not want people to respond to sensationalism, He wants people to respond to who He is and what He has done for them on the cross.

A CHALLENGE FOR YOU

- We will always be asking the question "Why"
- God will not give us the answers to the question "Why," but He will give us new insights that give us a new perspective on our difficult times.
- Have you looked at your situation from God's perspective??

- Acknowledge that the Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, <u>died</u> on the cross for your sin, and that He <u>arose</u> again from the dead on the third day.
- 2. Admit that you are a sinner, guilty of sin and responsible and accountable to a holy God for your sin, and that you are under His just condemnation and eternal punishment for your sin.
- **3. Accept** the Lord Jesus Christ as your Lord and Saviour by **receiving** His provision of salvation through your faith in Him alone.
