LIVING FOR THE LORD IN BAD TIMES

JOYFUL ANTICIPATION 1 PETER 1:6-12

- **THE CONTEXT:** The basic theme of 1 Peter is the proper response to suffering.
- **THE PARADOX:** All of us will face various kinds of difficulties and problems in life.
 - It is easy to become confused, frustrated, fearful, stressed, and even bitter
 - It is easy to believe that has God has somehow forgotten us, withdrawn His favor from us, or is punishing us.
 - Although a believer may become bewildered and discouraged in the midst of a difficulty, the anticipation of something great has a way of making the past and the present seem unimportant.
- **LESSON:** The future **anticipation** of the believer governs the believer's **perspective** of the present.
- I Peter 1:6-12 shows us two ways how this is true.

ANTICIPATION OF A FUTURE HOPE RESULTS IN PRESENT <u>REJOICING</u> INSPITE OF <u>PRESENT</u> <u>TRIALS</u>. 1 PETER 1:6-7





- Present Trials Cause Grief in the Present--But They do not Stop the Joy of the Future Hope. 1:6
 - Grief from trials are
 present, but only for a little while.
 - Trials are real and do cause grief.
 - Trials cannot take away our future hope.
 - Grief from trials are
 necessary, but only for a little while.
 - God, for His own reasons, allows trials in our life.
 - We should not become bitter due to trials because of our great future hope.



- Present Trials Have the Purpose of **Testing** Faith--But They do not
 Stop the Joy of the
 Future Hope.
 - The purpose of trials, regardless of the reason, is to refine or purify one's faith, i.e., to mature our faith.
 - The purpose of trials, regardless of the reason, is to prove the reality on one's faith, i.e., to prove if one's faith is genuine.

ANTICIPATION OF A FUTURE HOPE RESULTS IN PRESENT REJOICING INSPITE OF <u>PROOFLESS</u> <u>TRUTH.</u> 1 PETER 1:8-12





- Without Ever Seeing Jesus, Believers Love Him.
 - Question: How can you love somebody you never seen?
 - Answer: You believe the message about Him as the Word of God.
 - Note: We do not know what Jesus looks like!



- Without Ever Seeing
 Jesus, believers believe
 in Him and rejoice in
 His promises.
 - Question: How can you believer in someone whose promises you never personally heard?
 - Answer: You believe the message about who He is, what He has done, and what He has promised.
 - Note: Jesus never wrote anything like a book, letter, or poem.



- Without Ever Seeing Jesus, believers receive as the result of their faith in Him the salvation of their souls.
 - Question: How do you
 know that salvation
 based on faith in Jesus
 is real?
 - Answer: The salvation is confirmed and affirmed by the prophesies of the O.T. prophets.



- The O.T. prophets prophesied of the grace that would come to believers.
 - The O.T. prophets did not produce their prophesied based upon their own testimony, reason, wisdom, intelligence, or wishful thinking; but by the inspiration of the Spirit of Christ who was speaking in and through them.

The Prophets

- Moses is the first of many Old Testament prophets to speak for God.

- The Spirit of Christ who was in the O.T. prophets was testifying beforehand the sufferings of Christ and the glories that would follow--the prophets wanted more details as to the timing of their fulfillment.
- The O.T. prophets, who prophesied of the grace that would come to believers, were prophesying of the things now preached in the gospel message.



- Even the angels desire to look into the things preached to us in the gospel—which were confirm beforehand by the prophets through the Spirit of Christ within them.
 - Angels know the gospel message.
 - Angels even rejoice at the salvation of a sinner (Luke 15:10)
 - Angels, like the prophets, want to know the timing off the glories that would follow
